Online Registration

Register by mail

Route

This flat, fast 3.1 mile course starts and finishes at Bellevue Crossroads Park. The route winds through surrounding East Bellevue neighborhoods before turning back to finish at the park located at NE 8th Street and 164th Avenue NE.
